

The Media Classic: It's special for all involved

When the Media Classic was conceived in 1994 by the sports departments of the Yakima Herald-Republic and the Tri-City Herald, it was considered the grand finale to the long high school basketball season.

The top 10 boys and the top 10 girls basketball players from each readership area of the newspapers were asked if they were interested in playing.

The first Classic was played at Eisenhower High School in Yakima, with the Tri-City boys winning 83-81 and the Tri-City girls winning 94-92.

The Yakima boys have since taken control of the series leading it 12-2. Meanwhile, the Tri-City girls hold a 8-6 lead.



Since that first game, the event has been changed and modified to make the experience more fun and enjoyable for those involved.

In 2000, the series was expanded to give more athletes a chance to play. The athletes from the bigger classification schools, the Class 4A and 3A schools, would have their own game. So would the athletes from the smaller Class 2A, 1A and B schools.

This year, more changes have been made to make the game even more special to the athletes. The four individual games were scrapped. Instead, one All-Star boys game and one All-Star girls game will be played. The rosters are expanded to 14 players per team to allow maximum participation.

The Classic also is special because all the proceeds raised through program sales and admission go to charity. Special Olympics is the recipient when the series is in the Tri-Cities. Special Olympics athletes will be on hand to present our souvenir plaques to the participating athletes.

The response has been terrific, and today basketball fans will get to see a lot of talented players that they may never have had a chance to see. Please, sit back and enjoy!

The technical specs of the game

- ◆ Today's game will played with four 12-minute quarters with a 15-minute halftime to allow for entertainment.
- ◆ The girls and boys will use a 30-second shot clock.
- ◆ Each player is allowed six personal fouls before fouling out.
- ◆ Dunking is permitted, but not encouraged on every basket.
- ◆ The name of the game is to have fun, and the coaches make every effort to ensure equal playing time among all athletes involved. The starting five were selected at random prior to the tipoff.
- ◆ All other high school and WIAA rules will be used.
- ◆ Our officials have been selected from the Tri-City Sports Officials Association.
